According to the American Heart Association*,

- Only **39% of women** receive CPR from bystanders in public compared to **45% of men**
- Men's odds of surviving a cardiac event are **23% higher than women's**
- There are several **myths and fears** about performing CPR on a female victim

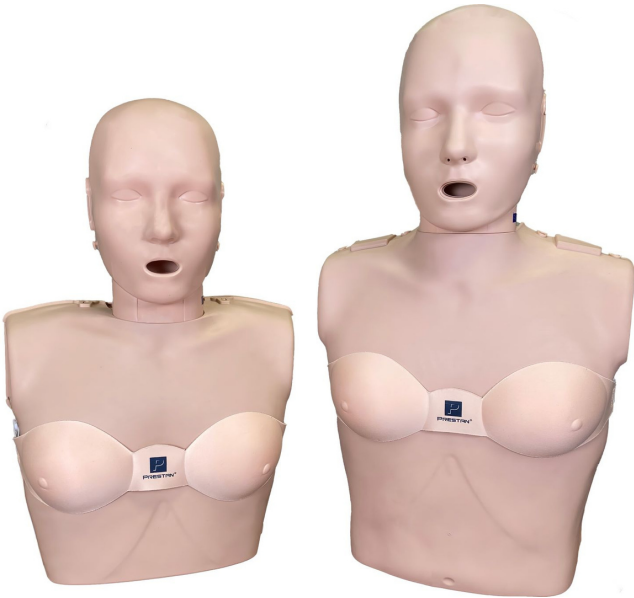
